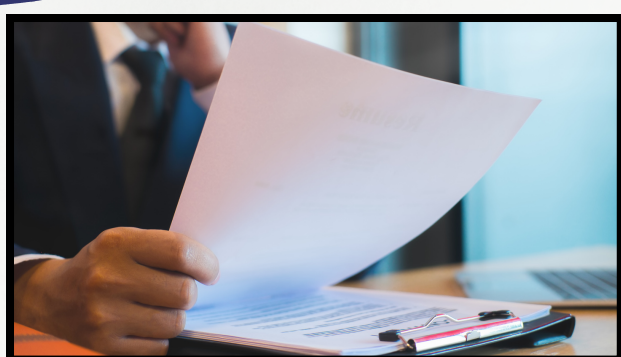


Effective Exam Design: 6 Key Strategies for Faculty!

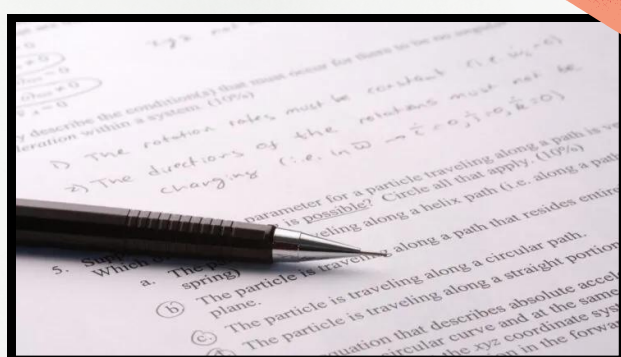
#1 Align with Learning Objectives

#2 Past Exams Review

Revisit past exams or assignments to identify common areas of difficulty. This can inform areas that may need more focused assessment in the current exam.



#3 Diverse Question Types

Incorporate a mix of question formats (e.g., multiple-choice, essay, problem-solving) to assess different skills and accommodate the various learning styles and needs.

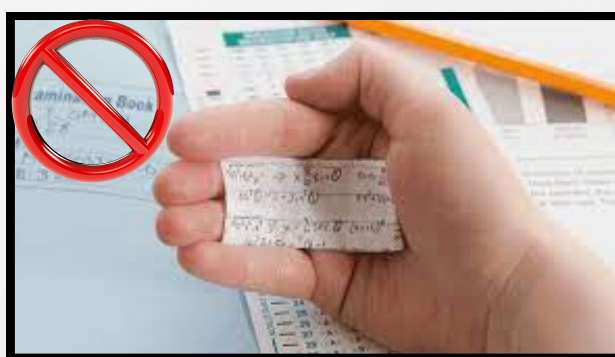
#4 Clear and Concise Instructions

#5 Balanced Difficulty

#6 Academic Integrity
